Harald Ebner is a Member of the German Bundestag. He was born on 8 July 1964 in Göppingen (Baden-Württemberg).

After graduating with a degree in agricultural sciences from the University of Hohenheim, Harald Ebner worked as a freelance landscape ecologist from 1993, and was employed by the nature conservation administration of the federal state of Baden-Württemberg from 2000 to 2011.

Harald Ebner has been a Member of the German Bundestag since May 2011 and is currently spokesman on genetic engineering and the bioeconomy and spokesman on forest policy for the Alliance 90/The Greens parliamentary group in the Bundestag.

Harald Ebner sits on the Committee on Food and Agriculture and is spokesman of his parliamentary group on the Committee. He is spokesman of the Bundestag group of Alliance 90/The Greens parliamentarians from Baden-Württemberg. He represents constituency 268 – Schwäbisch Hall/Hohenlohe – in the north-east of Baden-Württemberg.

The key issues which Mr Ebner addresses in his work as a Member are the intersections between agriculture and nature conservation, as well as agriculture's future direction. Harald Ebner focuses on a range of issues on behalf of the Alliance 90/The Greens parliamentary group in the Bundestag, in particular issues relating to genetic engineering in agriculture, pesticide use and reduction, organic farming and the organic food sector, forest policy, the bioeconomy, and the effects of free trade agreements such as TTIP and CETA on agriculture and consumer protection.
